Please note that college board scores are required. If you have not already taken the ACT or SAT, you should do so by October 22 or November 5, respectively, to assure that you have scores to report by the December 11 postmark date. Your application is intended to provide preliminary information to the Scholarship Committee. After an initial screening by that Committee, some applicants will be selected as semi-finalists and asked to supply written recommendations, transcripts, and confirmation of test scores. These semi-finalists will be notified on or about January 25, 2007 and given approximately two weeks to compile and forward additional materials. Please do not send recommendations or any other material at this time.

Also, do not select a newscast or news-oriented program such as *Sixty Minutes* or *Frontline*.)

Remember, these materials must be post-marked by Monday, December 11, 2006. All information supplied to the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences Scholarship Committee must be accurate and is subject to verification. Scholarship winners will be determined by the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences Trustees, and all decisions are final.
