After an initial screening by that Committee, some applicants will be selected as semifinalists and may be asked to supply written recommendations, transcripts, and confirmation of test scores. Finalists will be asked to supply DVDs of their most creative video productions. Please do not send recommendations, photographs, or any other material at this time. Do not use binders and send all five applications in a single large envelope.

(Be sure to select a multiple-episode program, not a single program or mini-series. Also, do not select a newscast or new-oriented program such as *Sixty Minutes* or *Frontline*.)

Mail **five copies** of this application, the accompanying essays, and other attachments to the address on page one of this form. Remember, your application packet must be post-marked by Monday, Jan. 30, 2012. All information supplied to the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences Scholarship Committee must be accurate and is subject to verification. Trustees of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences will determine the scholarship recipient and their decision is final.
